



'Remake Festival' emphasizes on developing innovation and collaborative partnership of youth through idea, strategy, concept exchange and implementation. The projects aims to educate and spread awareness among people about the contemporary environmental issues and also bring out the best ideas of environment conservation within the people so that they are able to advocate and attract the attention of the concerned authorities. 'Remake Festival' along with 'Infotainment Workshop' is expected to develop creative sustainable living idea for their city and later spread out to other cities.

Following are a list of activities included in their project:

1. The team partnered with two stake holders who assisted the team with the project; Bottle House Group and 'We for change' under TDHG (terre des hommes, Germany), collaborated with the team.
2. The 'Infotainment Workshop'- The team conducted an infotainment workshop in one school each in Kathmandu, Lalitpur and Bhaktapur. The schools where the workshops took place were Neric Academy, Uma Maheshwor Secondary Boarding School and A.B. Secondary Boarding School respectively.
3. The team announced an open application call for various institutes, schools and colleges to participate in the 'Remake Festival'.
4. The team demonstrated innovative campaigns of 'No thanks ! I carry my own Bag' and 'Hamri Baini' which are youth led campaigns to ban use of plastic bags in Nepal.
5. The team also met organic farmers in Palpa, and interacted with them to understand the techniques and importance of organic farming. They informed the farmers about the 3Rs campaign they were conducting in their area.

The project focuses on the two major activities - the 'Remake Festival' and the 'Infotainment Workshop'. In the initial phase the team focused on organizing seminars and workshops for schools and colleges, spreading awareness about the 3R concept i.e. Reduce, Reuse and Recycle. The later phase focused on preparing for the event Remake Festival, where 20 to 25 innovative ideas on environmental sustainability/conservation were demonstrated by youth participants. The last team looks for additional financial support, and potential partners to collaborate.
